Farms have increased in acreage size, requiring a greater time commitment from producers to plant and harvest their own crop, much less a neighbor's crop. Thanks to the free planting and harvesting assistance provided by Farm Rescue, families are able to bridge crises so they have an opportunity to continue viable operations for future generations.

The continuation of viable farms is the organization's focus. These viable operations are the backbone that sustains the strength of rural communities and businesses. As a result of the assistance provided by Farm Rescue, farm families can survive potentially devastating circumstances, enabling them to keep the family business intact, which in turn helps the economic well being of communities. The tangible and intangible benefits of Farm Rescue assistance are far-reaching in terms of families and communities.

Story of Assistance

The Klemetson family has been farming outside of Ulen, MN, since the 1930's. Matt's grandfather was the first of the Klemetsons to work the land, and then his father continued that tradition in 1966. Growing up on the farm, Matt had always dreamed of carrying on the rural heritage of the family farm by living there himself someday.

Matt's dreams began to come true when he married his high school sweetheart, Staci, and they began a family of their own. After the passing of Matt's father, the young couple moved to the family farm to thrive off the land and raise their children on the same soil that had been the roots of the Klemetson family for the past 80 years.

Five children later, Matt and Staci appeared to be living the dream of the American farm family. Matt worked the land while Staci homeschooled the children and helped with the numerous tasks associated with farming.

In 2011, Staci, a non-smoker, was diagnosed with lung cancer. The chemo treatments appeared to be working and the cancer was nearly in remission when it suddenly spread to her bones and her brain.

When spring rolled around, Staci's sickness took precedence over the planting of crops, and Matt's priority became caring for his family. Matt's neighbors suggested that he contact Farm Rescue.

Farm Rescue rolled in with volunteers and sponsored equipment to relieve the stress of planting and allowed Matt to be there for Staci. He was nurse, doctor, helper and caregiver for Staci and their five children. Together, they held strong and fought the disease with hope and determination.

Unfortunately, Staci lost her battle as Farm Rescue finished the harvest of 2012. Her positive attitude was an inspiration to all who met her during her sickness.

Her faith was never daunting as reflected in her favorite scripture: "In all your ways acknowledge him, and he will make your paths straight."

Farm Rescue couldn't write the "happy ending" for this story, but it presented the Klemetson family with precious time together allowing them to plant a seed that will sprout a lifetime of memories for a father and five young children.



- 3. Upon approval, Farm Rescue will notify the family of our arrival date to plant or harvest crops.
- 4. Relax and know that you're in good hands. We have planted/harvested 100,000 + acres for 200 + farm families.
