onald and Marlys Schumacher from Minot, ND were due for some relief. On top of their farming operation, they were working multiple jobs, their son was serving in Afghanistan, and Marlys was battling advanced breast cancer for the fifth year. The spring fields needed to be planted, cows were calving and something had to give. With Marlys anticipating treatment in Chicago, Donald had no way to be with his wife during her treatment. They called Farm Rescue for help.

The Farm Rescue volunteers planted the oats and flax in two days. This was just the break the Schumachers needed in order to be together during a difficult medical situation. The sheer relief of knowing that the crop was being planted allowed Don and Marlys to spend a bit more precious time together during Marlys's treatment: just what they asked for. Virginia Schumacher, family member and farming partner, repeatedly thanked Farm

avid and Lisa Axmear had been away from their farm in North English, Iowa for two years. David, who had been awaiting a heart transplant, found the medical treatment he needed in Phoenix, Arizona and was staying close to the specialized treatment facility so he could be monitored and cared for while his name rose steadily up the waiting list. As a farmer, it's extremely difficult to run a farming operation when you can't be there to keep the farm going.

David contacted Farm Rescue to see if there was a possibility that his crop could be harvested while he was away. The wheels were immediately set into motion to ensure this family's farm was taken care of while they were away. As his crops ripened, David received his long-awaited heart. A week later, Farm Rescue equipment showed up right on time to assist with the soybean and corn harvest.

In a very thoughtful note of thanks to Farm Rescue and its volunteers, David said, "I hope my story can bring awareness to Farm Rescue. A friend told me about it, and it was very hard to ask for help, but everyone was so professional. When I was told to 'Just relax and it would be taken care of,' I was so relieved. I sure hope to meet the wonderful people who helped at the farm. I am a lucky man in so many ways to have an army of angels all for just one man!"




