Story of Assistance



In November of 2013, Mathew Fischer's life was changed forever. While doing some routine maintenance on the hay mover, his Carhartt coveralls became entangled in the chains. When he finally broke free, Matt was missing his left arm, and his left leg was badly mangled. He crawled to his pickup and drove to his mother's house, and was airlifted to the hospital.

Matt's first week in the hospital was occupied with multiple surgeries but his stubborn, farm-raised body refused to let something like losing his left arm and leg slow him down. He started physical therapy only two weeks into his stay at the hospital and moved home after the third week. He continued therapy as soon as his prosthetics arrived. The year was not yet over, but Matt was already thinking about the next spring's planting to be done. With some encouragement, the Fischer's applied for planting assistance from Farm Rescue and the application was quickly approved.

In May, a Farm Rescue volunteer planting crew was sent to the Fischer farm. The RDO Equipment Company sponsored tractor and air seeder were a comforting sight upon arrival. The volunteers were instant friends of the family, and worked with them to get the planting completed in a timely manner. With some difficulty, Matt was able to join them in the field, learning how to overcome the challenges that prosthetic limbs can bring to a farming operation. Throughout this experience, the Fischer's neighbors stepped up to take care of Matt's cattle while also providing the family with food, visits and prayers.
