Farm Rescue Selected To Receive \$347,690 Grant From The Leona M. and Harry B. Helmsley Charitable Trust

JAMESTOWN, N.D, March 19, 2013 - Farm Rescue, a nonprofit organization that provides planting and harvesting assistance free of charge to farm families who have experienced a major illness, injury or natural disaster, will receive a grant totaling \$347,690 from The Leona M. and Harry B. Helmsley Charitable Trust. The grant, which was awarded to Farm Rescue through The Trust's Rural Healthcare Program, will be used for equipment purchases and general operations.

Helmsley Charitable Trust to help farm families and rural communities through Farm Rescue," said Bill Gross, Farm Rescue president and founder. "This is the largest grant received since the inception of Farm Rescue and will allow us to acquire the necessary equipment to provide efficient and timely assistance to more families."
