Farm Rescue Offers Support to North Dakota Wildfire Victims

Nonprofit activates 'Operation Hay Lift' to provide relief to impacted ranchers

HORACE, N.D., October 14, 2024 - Farm Rescue, a nonprofit organization that provides free planting, haying, harvesting, commodity hauling, and livestock feeding assistance to farm families who have experienced a major illness, injury, or natural disaster, is gathering support for families impacted by recent wildfires.

Farm Rescue is again activating "Operation Hay Lift" to haul much-needed livestock feed and supplies to ranchers affected by these natural disasters. Early October wildfires, fueled by strong winds and dry conditions, burned tens of thousands of acres across western North Dakota. Two men have died in relation to the fires, as well as numerous livestock. The blazes also claimed several homes, outbuildings, equipment, and fencing.

To support this relief effort, Farm Rescue is requesting hay donations in close proximity to these impacted areas, which will be distributed on a first-come, first-served basis. Affected ranchers are asked to submit an application for Hay Hauling Assistance at <u>farmrescue.org/apply</u>.

The nonprofit has already sourced approximately 2,000 round bales of hay and straw from donors throughout the region, but additional feed supplies will be needed. Those interested in donating hay can email info@farmrescue.org or call 701-252-2017.

Farm Rescue is also asking for monetary donations to help fund this disaster response campaign. These contributions will support the mobilization of trucks and volunteer drivers, as they transport hay and supplies from multiple donation sites to impacted farms. "For nearly 20 years, Farm Rescue has been committed to supporting families and communities when help is needed most. As damage assessments continue and additional needs are determined, Gross also expects to see an increased demand for Farm Rescue's core services heading into 2025, including planting, haying, and harvest support.
