The mission of Farm Rescue is critical and demand for our assistance services has increased each of the fifteen years since I founded the organization. Together, we have assisted 700+ farm and ranch families in their darkest hour.

The success of our mission is directly attributed to a team of dedicated staff and volunteers who are able to mobilize throughout the region, thanks to the loyal support of individual donors, grantors and sponsors. Sponsor and volunteer retention rates year-over-year are 90% and 70%, respectively. These numbers are clear indicators of the unwavering support for our mission.

The rate of farm and ranch families who have maintained operations three years after our assistance is 97%. There is no doubt that we are achieving our objective: to provide an opportunity for farm and ranch families who have experienced a major injury, illness or natural disaster to continue their livelihood.

# Stories of Assistance

**WILLARD AND ANTHONY RUZICKA** – Verdigre, NE: Imagine more than 150 years' worth of family history being swept away in just a few short hours. That was the heartbreaking reality for the sixth-generation Ruzicka farm near Verdigre, NE in the spring of 2019. After receiving an early morning phone call, warning them of the nearby Spencer Dam collapse, Willard Ruzicka, his wife, Denise, and son, Anthony, grabbed whatever they could carry and evacuated their homes. The rush of water released on the Niobrara River and a sea of massive ice chunks destroyed nearly all of their operation. With some of their cattle remaining to care for, the Ruzickas began a tremendous cleanup effort and vowed to rebuild their family's legacy. They were one of many families to receive hay and supplies through Farm Rescue's "Operation Hay Lift". This relief effort was launched to provide support to ranchers in the wake of catastrophic flooding in portions of Nebraska, Iowa and South Dakota.

**BOB AND CONNIE HERMANN** – Lemmon, SD: The windows of opportunity are often narrow in the world of farming, so when the unexpected happens, it can create many issues for an operation. When Bob Hermann was diagnosed with stage 4 pancreatic cancer, he and his wife, Connie, knew they needed some help in reaping what had been sown throughout the spring. In July of 2019, they contacted Farm Rescue to assist with their harvest. Our volunteers took great pride in finishing the Hermann's wheat crop and hauling hay in from their fields, which allowed Bob to focus on his battle and recovery. "We will never forget what Farm Rescue did for us. They truly exemplify the spirit of America – helping one another in a time of need," Connie said.

**LEVI AND JESS BOEHM** – McClusky, ND: It was a ride that began like any other for Jess Boehm and one of her most trusted horses, as the pair took a warmup lap around their farmyard in early July 2019. A sudden loss of footing sent the horse to its side and slammed Jess against the ground. Her loss of consciousness prompted her husband, Levi, to call for an ambulance. After a week in the intensive care unit, and another week and a half in a Bismarck hospital, the Boehms traveled to Craig Hospital in Colorado to continue Jess' rehab from a traumatic brain injury. With an unknown timeline for recovery and harvest fast-approaching, Levi gave a family friend the green light to contact Farm Rescue. Our Angels in Blue were honored to assist the Boehms with their barley and wheat harvest. Miraculously, Jess and Levi returned home ahead of schedule to reunite with their 3 young daughters and resume harvest operations. "There's really no good word to describe what Farm Rescue does for people, except just – awesome," Jess said.
